

## Map Work

- 1. Have students locate Israel on their map, put their finger on it
- Have students locate Judah on their map, put their finger on it – Remind children that once this was one kingdom, but it divided after King Solomon died.
- 3. Have students locate Assyria on their Map
- 4. God allowed Assyria to come in and destroy Israel.
- 5. Put an X on Israel
- 6. Have students locate Babylon on their map. This was home to King Nebuchadnezzar.
- 7. Tell students that Babylon came in and took over Assyria.
- 8. Put an X on Assyria
- 9. Finally, Babylon will come and completely destroy Judah. He will burn the temple that was built by Solomon.
- 10. Students can spend some coloring the map.
